DISCOVERING HIS PERSONAL DRIVE

RJ & Bobby

Growing up, Little Brother RJ's mother was a Little Sister in the Big Brothers Big Sisters program and wanted the same positive experience for her son. She enrolled him in our program in 2019 and RJ was thrilled to find a reliable and positive role model in his Big Brother, Bobby.



Bobby has a strong belief in the power of mentorship because he has been blessed with many mentors. "I had a strong father, coaches, teachers, and business mentors throughout my life from whom I have been able to learn. I wanted the opportunity to give back in that same capacity. I have a passion for mentorship and I felt that joining Big Brothers Big Sisters and becoming a mentor for RJ was the right thing to do," said Bobby.

Bobby and RJ first met four years ago and began having regular outings going out for meals and getting to know one another. Bobby worked with RJ and his mother to

decide what RJ was interested in and what things they could do together that they would both enjoy. They quickly bonded over their love of sports and the outdoors. Over the years, they have collected memorable experiences at sporting events, fishing on Bobby's boat, exploring nature trails, trying new recipes, and visiting trampoline parks.

Bobby's most poignant memory is when he took RJ fishing for the very first time. They shared conversations about oceanic wildlife, ecosystems, and music. "We caught a lot of fish that day, but the most fun part was just jamming out to the stereo and seeing RJ with his hat on backward, bobbing his head to the music as we went through the Charleston Harbor. I will have a vivid image of that in my head for the rest of my life," said Bobby.

Since being matched with Bobby, RJ's mother has seen his behavior improve and his communication skills grow. He more easily completes homework, his math grades have improved, and he has been successful in connecting with his classmates at his new school. RJ's mother feels the match with Bobby has put RJ "on track to become a successful adult."

Throughout their time together, Bobby and RJ have had many conversations about personal values. "RJ has grown significantly from a 9-year-old boy to his entry into young adulthood. He has gained an understanding of what it means to be a man in a family and the maturity and responsibility that are needed. Being respectful, loving, working

hard, and being honorable are values that he has begun to embrace," said Bobby. Bobby has helped RJ grow his business acumen, explore entrepreneurship, and develop a strong work ethic. RJ's favorite memory is running a hot chocolate stand and a lemonade stand with Bobby's help. "I love doing the lemonade and hot chocolate stand in Bobby's neighborhood," RJ shared. "You can make money, talk to people, meet new people around the neighborhood, and I get to see Bobby's family. It has taught me to run a business and I like doing business with people."

RJ used the money that was made at the hot chocolate stand to buy Christmas gifts for his mother and siblings. Always generous and caring, RJ even asked Bobby if they could buy food for a homeless person they saw on the street. Bobby shared that RJ radiates curiosity, positivity, kindness, and graciousness. Seeing RJ's increasing empathy towards others has inspired Bobby and left him feeling incredibly proud of the young man RJ is becoming.

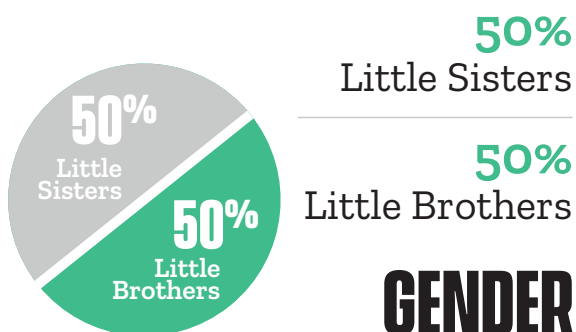

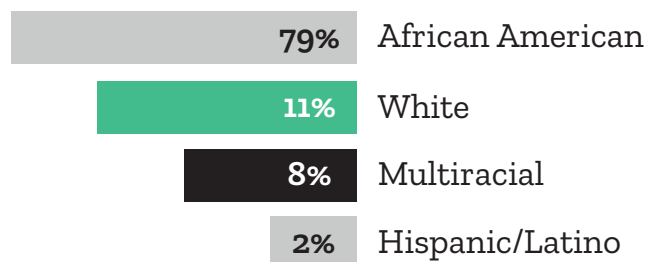

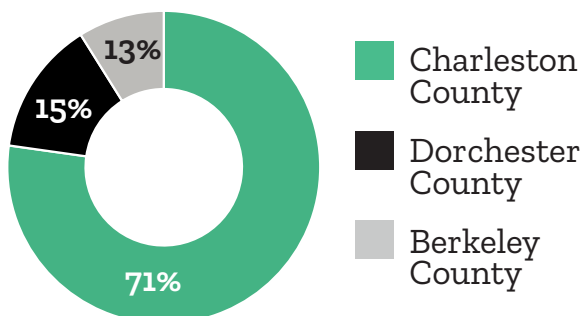

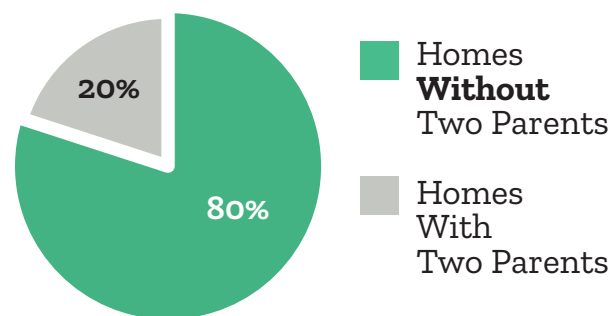

Big Sister Yeakia and Little Sister Aliyah embarked on their mentorship journey through Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Lowcountry in the spring of 2021. Big Sister Yeakia, a Senior Project Manager at Boeing, became a mentor because of her vast interest in coaching youth.

"I wanted to be able to impact one person consistently to see how they grow and develop throughout their life," said Yeakia.

When Aliyah and Yeakia first met, they had conversations about her interests and connected with Aliyah's mom to ensure their time together was enjoyable and enriching. Their first outing was at Riverfront Park. Yeakia knew that Aliyah

loved art so she brought some paint and easels and they Googled photos of things they could draw. Although their paintings didn't turn out QUITE how they looked online, they shared plenty of laughter and created a cherished memory.

Their journey together has been filled with adventures from hockey games, volunteering in the community, exploring STEM events, and Yeakia attending Aliyah's school performances. Yeakia is dedicated to exposing Aliyah to new opportunities and helping her grow.

"I like having Yeakia as a Big Sister because she is nice, kind, caring, and she has fun with me. Yeakia takes me places I've never been, ever," said Aliyah.

Beyond the fun and laughter, Yeakia has been a positive influence on Aliyah's life. She teaches her valuable life skills like money management and provides academic support.

Aliyah has blossomed since being matched with Yeakia, becoming more confident, outgoing, and eager to engage in the community.

Aliyah's mother originally signed her up for Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Lowcountry to encourage her to get out of the house and experience new things. Through her partnership with Yeakia, Aliyah has indeed discovered the joy of trying new things and the importance of having a caring mentor by her side.

As Yeakia points out, it's crucial for young women like Aliyah to have mentors who represent different backgrounds and experiences. These mentors help shape their potential and provide the inspiration they need to navigate life's challenges and opportunities.

For a young girl to see how a woman maneuvers through life is very important. It shapes who she can be and gives her the potential to tap into everything she has to become who she wants to be. It's important for young girls to have a positive representation of themselves.

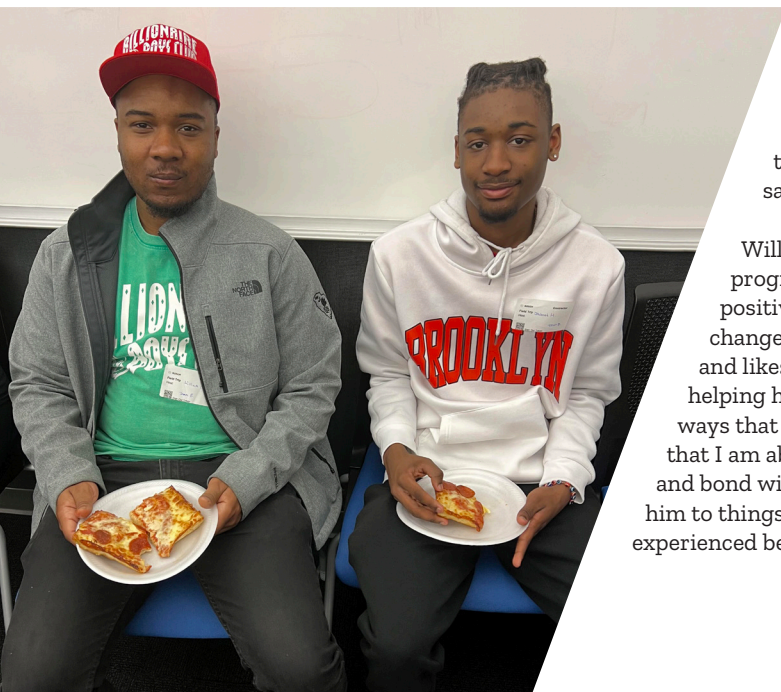

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

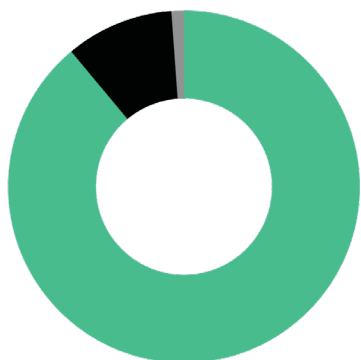


In our fourth year of operation, Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Lowcountry aims to achieve organizational stability long-term.

We take YOUR financial trust in us seriously, and we will continue to be good stewards of funds.

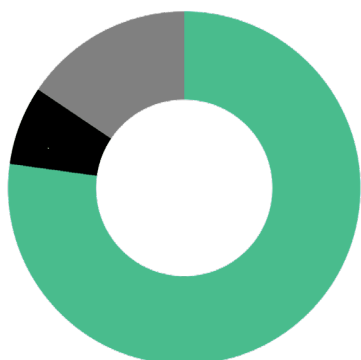
TOTAL REVENUE

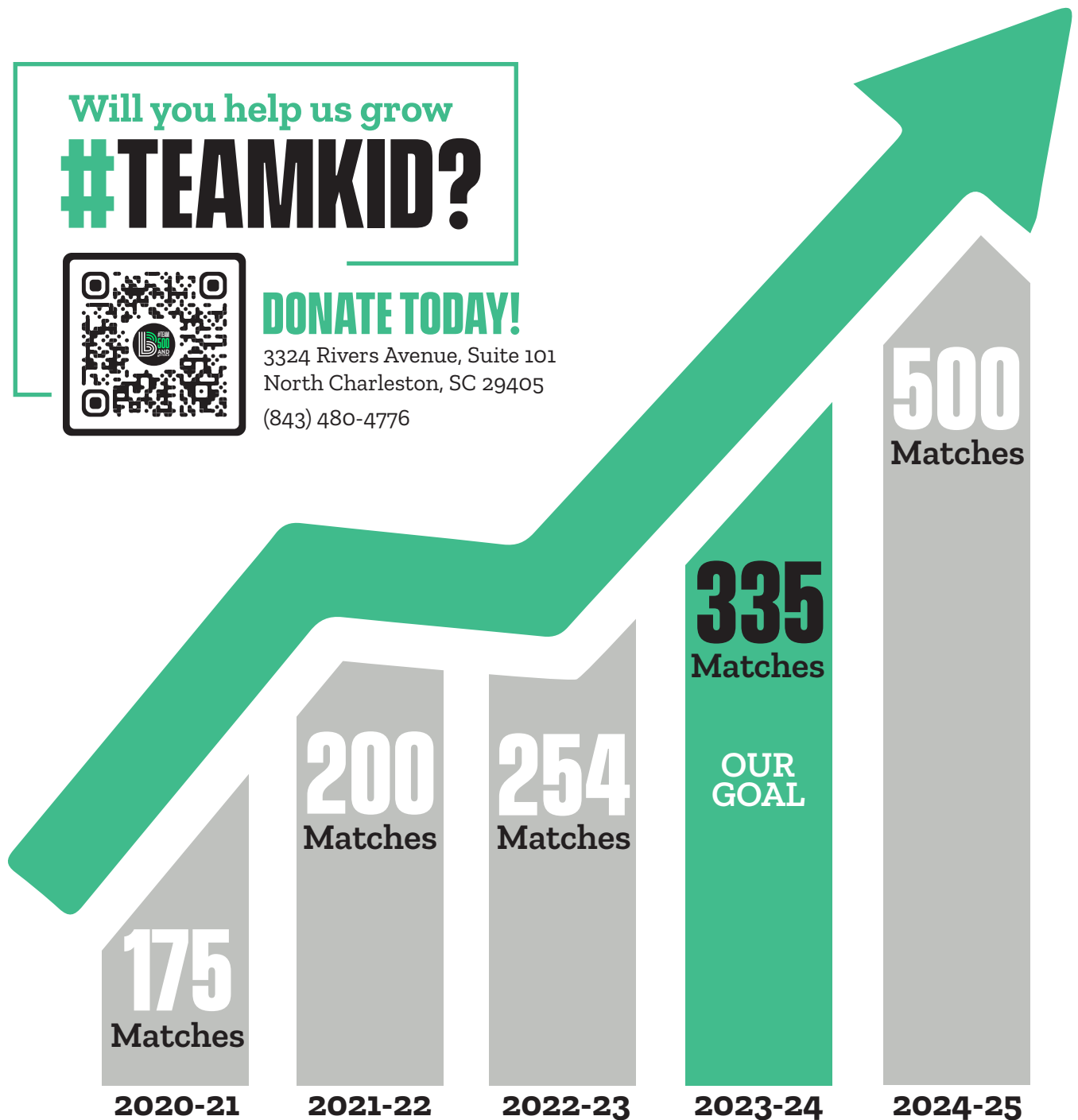
